

Celebration and rituals are in our blood. Whether it is a new tradition created by a community, the pre-Lent tradition or a seasonal festivity associated with the pre-Christian calendar. Throughout history, all over the world, people have celebrated carnival and are still celebrating to this day. In many countries, carnival is the festival held in the days leading up to Lent-the 40 days of fasting and penitence before Easter. Sometimes starting as early as the 6th January or even St. Stephen's day, communities would come together for processions, dances, music and feasting, after a hard year working. The frenzied partying climaxing on Mardi Gras (literally translated as Fat Tuesday) the day before Ash Wednesday. This was the final chance to eat, drink and be merry before the restrictions of lent and everyday life-hence carne vale-'goodbye to meat!'

WHAT IS ROTARY?

"Service above Self"

Rotary is an international, service club organisation whose members volunteer their time and talents to serve their communities and the world. Rotary was founded in America in 1905. The first clubs in Great Britain were formed in 1910/11. The organisation currently has some 31,000 clubs in more than 165 countries and some 1.2 million members.

What is the Object of Rotary?

The Object of Rotary is to encourage and foster the ideal of service as a basis of worthy enterprise and, in particular, to encourage and foster:

- * The development of acquaintance as an opportunity for service;
- * High ethical standards in business and professions; the recognition of the worthiness of all useful occupations; and the dignity of each Rotarian's occupation to serve society;
- * The application of the idea of service in each Rotarian's personal, business and community life;
- * The advancement of international understanding, goodwill and peace through a world fellowship of business and professional persons united in the idea of service.

What does Rotary Do Locally?

Rotary Clubs raise money and provide assistance "in kind" to help support a number of local charitable and community groups. Annually we organise the "Kids Out" trip for disadvantaged children. We have organised Redhill Carnival 2007 to raise funds in aid of Surrey Air Ambulance Appeal, Live at Home, Us in a Bus, Orbit Shed and other Rotary charities.

How can I become a Rotarian?

Membership of Rotary is open, by invitation, to professional and business men and women who are prepared to commit their time and talents for the service of others.
